Not only do our little one's love splashing around in the water, but it has so many developmental benefits. Water helps develop your child's fine and gross motor skills; it has a huge impact on your child's hand-eye coordination. It can have a relaxing and therapeutic effect on your little one, it helps with concentration and the sensory play for babies can have a positive impact on the sensory function of your child.

If you would like your little one to take part, please provide your little one on these days with a splash bag, including a towel and something your happy for your little one to get wet in. The activities will be carried out indoors or out weather dependant. It will be a fun session full of bubbles, sensory experiences and of course water!

Jungle Room (2-3 years)



Our jungle room alongside our pre-school children had an incredible experience this term when we discovered a honeybee hive in our tree in the garden. The children were invited to watch as the gentleman from Beighton Bees came to take our bees to a safe spot for them to make their honey.



From this the children extended their learning by looking more closely at bees, making their own using craft materials developing their fine motor skills. They also discussed how we can help to look after the bees as they are so very helpful and make delicious honey!



The jungle team with help from the Little Kingdom children have been busy planting some beautiful flowers, herbs and vegetables in our allotment to help with pollination and also grow our own produce for the nursery to use and eat. What an incredible learning opportunity this was!

Little Kingdom Room (3-5 years)

Our pre-school children have had a busy term so far as they have had a huge interest in farming and the natural world. A we plan based on children's interest and experiences we have incorporated getting "school ready" into the learning opportunities as they arise. From creating a chicken coop counting and using mathematical language in questioning, to identifying and forming shapes, colours and patterns on different insects to exploring letters and sounds during group time.



We also had Kixx join us for the month of April, the programme was carefully designed for both boys and girls between the ages of 2 years and 10 years of age. All sessions provided a fun, playful, safe environment which encourages children to develop a positive sense of themselves, respect for others, a positive disposition to learn new skills, and a sense of pride in their ability to master them.



This is a key developmental age for all our **children** and the sessions hit all the major gross motor skills goals such as agility, balance, coordination but also emphasise things such as self- confidence, listening, communication skills and of course being part of a team.
