Drop off times

Can we please ensure that children are getting dropped off at the time their session starts and collected either before or at the time the session ends as there has been a number of cases where children are getting dropped off 10-15 minutes early or collected past their session time. As you can appreciate as a nursery it is essential that we adhere to ratios.

Our staff start at different times to ensure we are always adhering to these but 5 minutes early/late can make a difference.

For us to ensure that ratios and the safety of children and staff are adhered to, staff will now be asking you to wait with your child if you are early for your child's session.

Thank you for your co-operation.

Staff Training

We want to keep you up to date with training that our staff have attended.

We are in the process of completing the HEY award. This is an award which is based around children's healthy eating, lifestyle and physical development. We have been assessed and have actioned some points already and there is much more to work on. In every room (not Outer Space) we now have rolling dinner. This means there are two sittings for lunch so the learning day does not need to stop.

Samijo is completing a SENCO Award (Level 3) where she will work alongside our nursery SENCO-Megan Batty to ensure all individual needs are catered for, and we have up to date expert knowledge.

Beki and Laura completed a 'Loose parts' training where it enabled them to gain more understanding in how and why we use items which would be recycled. It gives the children chance to express their creativity and flourish in an enriched learning environment.

Leigh is participating in an ongoing course 'Hand Writing for boys' as we want to explore and extend the different ways in which we can help and encourage mark marking with boys.

PARENT PANEL



Our first parent panel meeting was held on Thursday 31st January, it was lovely to have such a wonderful group of parents getting together to discuss nursery life, share expertise and experiences. Here are the points raised for you to see. We would like more to join our parent panel, therefor if you are interested our next meeting is on Thursday 28th March 2019 6pm-7pm (hopefully it wont run over next time).

-Our chef is going to begin to host a baking class with the 2 years and above, this includes pastries, cakes and savoury treats to help children get more involved in their foods that they eat.

-Our additional extracurricular activities at present are Pyjama Drama (under 2's) and Mini Moves (over 2's). The parents suggested a number of other outside agencies that could possible join us and we are currently looking into them for the future.

-Our first nursery trip for each room will be coming up soon, children to staff ratio is halved and you will have to give prior written consent. Children over 2 will walk with a walking bus or will hold hands with a staff member. Under 2's may request you to bring in your buggy or pram from home.

-We would like to get more involved in the community, therefore if you know of any local events please let us know. On February 22nd was the anniversary of the plane crash 75 years ago in Endlciffe Park, where we will see it be honoured with a military fly by. We supported the event by getting the children outside to observe the display, which lead to children's interest in air crafts and the army. We are looking into getting involved in Gay ride, Sheffield Food Festival and would love to get involved in many more.

-It has been raised that for the safety of our parents/carers/children and visitors that walk/cycle/scoot to nursery there is no safe pathway. Therefor we have spoken to the landlord and business owner to make plans this year to paint lines for a walking safety path from the main road to the front door.

-Bugs and illnesses that are contagious and have more than 1 case within your child's room will now be sent out to inform you to look out for any possible symptoms via email and the parentzone app.

-It was suggested that we have a family fun day, possibly Chatsworth one Saturday in July where staff and families can come along for a picnic and games/activities. What a great idea! We will inform you of the date later on in the spring.
